
#### Reminders:

Stage this year, which seems to be the best spot. A flyer was submitted for December's newsletter and Camille will be sending ones home with students.

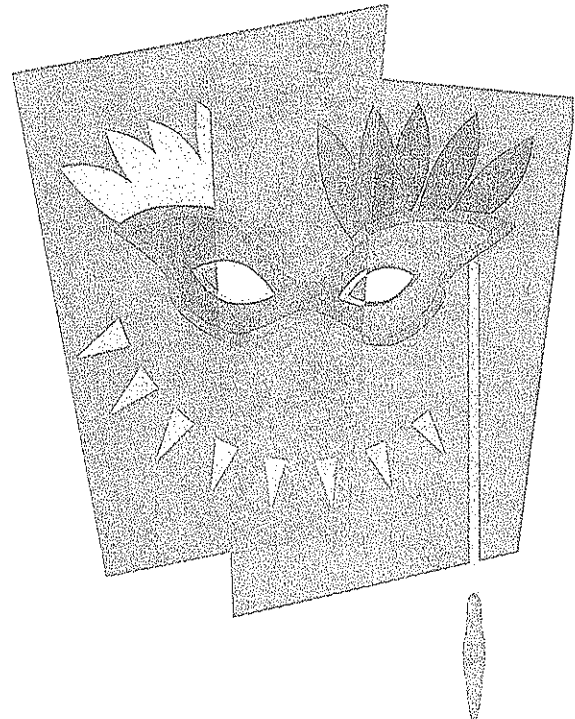
- PTSA was asked to contribute money to purchase passports for three seniors. We do not have the money at this time and we were unsure of doing something that doesn't benefit the entire class.
